UUWF is a community of women that seeks to enrich the lives of its members as well as the lives of the women and children of Santa Fe. UUWF is a volunteer organization that donates the proceeds from its programs to local Santa Fe charities.

As a place for women to meet other Santa Fe women, UUWF holds monthly luncheons from September through May featuring a speaker on various topics ranging from authors to travel and social justice topics and local culture and history. Speakers are generally from Santa Fe and our surrounding New Mexico community. UUWF also sponsors a monthly book group and hosts an annual retreat, which is a special time for building friendships and self-exploration. UUWF activities are open to any woman in the community, and it's not necessary to be a UUWF member or a member of UU Santa Fe to participate.
